DIVIDING THE SPOILS LESSON PLAN



Overview:

This lesson plan will challenge participants to recognize the how individualist and collectivist worldviews affect decision making and behaviors. They will be presented with a scenario where, based on their own worldview, they must decide how they will divide a monetary reward for a team project.

Background and Information:

This activity was originally created by Craig Storti and published in *Figuring Foreigners Out: A Practical Guide* (see citation below). However, a similar activity (called Sharing the Rewards) was created for the Peace Corps Cross-Cultural Workbook, which is linked on the following page.

Objectives:

As a result of this activity, participants will be able to:

- 1. Develop a world view that includes the outcomes of individualist versus communalist cultures.
- 2. Reflect deeply about the ways in which these world views affect cultural behaviors.
